1. Saul, who would later be known as Paul, believed his way of worshipping God was the only way and arrested the followers of Jesus who worshipped in a different way. Why do some people get angry with other people who are not exactly the same as they are?
2. People traveled often on horses in those days. Saul might have fallen to the ground when he and his horse were frightened by the bright light. Think of a time when you saw a very bright flash of lightning with loud thunder. How did it make you feel?
3. Saul heard a voice that told him, "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting." Persecute means to treat very badly. What do you think it means when we say, "If we hurt another person, Jesus suffers?"
4. Jesus didn't scold Saul for what he did, but instead told him where he should go to learn how to live a better life. Think of a time when you learned to like someone better when you learned more about that person.
